COURSE DESCRIPTION

- AIMS:

The deals with problems of the European human rights. It acquaints students with international and constitutional human rights protection systems. Analysis of the evolution of human rights with particular emphasis on the formation of concepts, legal structures and institutions characteristic for modern systems of protection of human rights. Students can apply management concepts to decisions and problems they would face after graduation. The knowledge will also increase their ability to think and act creatively.

Students should solve the problems on all 15 lessons with satisfactory results, make exercises. Marks are given according to the Polish 4-mark scale (5-the best)
