

SYLLABUS

SUBJECT: LEXICOGRAPHY (LECTURES)

TEACHER: DR DOROTA OSUCHOWSKA

COURSE DESCRIPTION:

An introductory course in lexicography, during which students master a number of basic concepts and issues connected with the theory and practice of dictionary making. The lectures cover types of dictionaries language learners and teachers have at their disposal, the difference between a linguistic dictionary and an encyclopaedia, dictionary structure, basic information categories presented in linguistic dictionaries, and other similar topics.

LEARNING OUTCOMES:

The concepts mastered should increase the student's awareness of the range of lexicographic works currently on offer and, on the other hand, enable them to select (aspects of) lexicography as a minor later on.

GRADING POLICY:

To earn a credit, one must participate in all but two lectures and pass a final exam.
