The course concerns the issues of Magdalenian technocomplex in Eastern Central Europe (Poland, Moravia, Bohemia). The problems of chronology, settlement pattern, taxonomy of lithics industries and art will be discussed. The problem of dispersal of Magdalenian groups in this part of Europe and relationships between these cultural provinces will be brought up also.
