COURSE DESCRIPTION

The lecture presents a cycle of cultural changes in the Polish territories from 2nd century BC until 5th century. Chronological systems which have been applied with regard to that period have been presented. Issues related to the Celtic culture and its influence on local cultures are discussed, and so are the Roman Time problems or rather the Roman influences in Poland. Topics related to antic written sources referring to the Polish territories are taken into account (Tacitus, Ptolemy, Jordanes).
