The following topics are discussed in the course:

- 3. information quality assessment
- 4. information management (including information security and ecology)

A failing grade (2.0) is given to a student who has prepared a project that does not meet the criteria;

A sufficient grade (3.0) is given to a student who has prepared a project treating the described topic in a superficial way, with little support from the scientific literature, lacking the qualities of detail and originality;

A sufficient plus grade (3.5) is given to a student who has prepared a project treating the described topic, with support from the basic scientific literature, containing qualities of detail and originality;

The grade Good (4.0) is awarded to a doctoral student who prepared a project treating the presented topic reliably, based on the latest scientific literature, detailed, but lacking the element of originality;

The grade Good plus (4.5) is awarded to a doctoral student who prepared a project treating the presented topic reliably, based on the latest scientific literature, detailed, with elements of originality;

The grade of very good (5.0) is awarded to a doctoral student who has prepared a project thoroughly describing the presented topic, based on the latest Polish and English-language scientific literature, detailed and cognitively original.
