BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF COURSE (100-200 words)

A dissertation workshop is a conversation class of a doctoral student with a promoter, the topics of which concern specialized methodology related to the research work being performed. The aim of the classes is, above all, the supervisor's substantive supervision of the doctoral student preparing her/his dissertation at the following stages: collecting and compiling materials, deepening knowledge of methodological tendencies in contemporary literary and translation studies, improving workshop skills and writing competence, critically analyzing scientific achievements within the discipline and drawing inspiration from it, evaluating one's own achievements and scientific projects, preparing individual parts of the dissertation and conference speeches and scientific publications.

The dissertation workshop program covers the successive stages of dissertation preparation, primarily:

- development of a plan and calendar of work on the dissertation,
- development of the title, thesis and outline of the dissertation,
- determination of workshop and technical issues of dissertation preparation,
- organization of access to sources and acquisition of materials,
- analysis of available dissertations and other publications on related issues,
- analysis of the current list of journals and scoring publications for possible places of publication of articles,
- analysis of methods of presenting scientific work (conferences, presentations, academic portals, databases, etc.)
- scientific writing workshops,
- regular reports on the progress of writing the dissertation and discussions on the successively emerging fragments,
- consultations related to revisions and additions to the entire dissertation.

COURSE ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

Graded credit after each semester of course completion is given on the basis of progress in the preparation of the dissertation and implementation of the studio plan. Possible semester grades are: 2.0, 3.0, 3.5, 4.0, 4.5, 5.0.
