

ENTRANCE EXAMINATION – INFORMATION FOR FOREIGN APPLICANTS

Important Notice

Some foreign candidates are required to take an entrance examination to verify academic knowledge necessary for admission to the Medicine Programme.

This requirement applies to candidates who:

- completed secondary education outside Poland, and
 - hold a certificate that is not recognised as a direct qualification for higher education admission under applicable regulations (outside EU, OECD, EFTA, Ukraine, or China – except Gaozhong certificate cases).

Purpose of the Examination

The examination assesses whether candidates have sufficient knowledge to begin medical studies.

It evaluates:

- understanding of biological and chemical processes
 - logical thinking in a scientific context
 - analytical and synthesis skills
 - readiness for medical education

Scope of the Examination

Biology

- cell structure and function
- cell cycle, mitosis, meiosis
- human body systems (nervous, circulatory, respiratory, digestive, urinary, reproductive, endocrine, immune)
- homeostasis

Chemistry

- chemical nomenclature and equations
- acids, bases and pH calculations
- molar mass and basic calculations

- periodic table and element properties

Exam Format

- Online examination (Testportal platform)
 - 20 multiple-choice questions (10 Biology + 10 Chemistry)
 - Duration: 30 minutes
 - Conducted by the Faculty Admissions Committee for the Medicine Programme in English

Technical Requirements

Candidates must ensure:

- stable internet connection
- computer or laptop with webcam and microphone
- Google Chrome or Mozilla Firefox browser recommended
- quiet, well-lit room without third parties present

Identity verification may be required before the exam.

Exam Rules

During the examination it is strictly prohibited to:

- use books, notes, mobile devices, or internet resources
- receive assistance from other persons
- disturb or interrupt the examination process

The exam must be completed independently.

Consequences of Violations

Any violation of exam rules will result in:

- disqualification from the examination
- exclusion from the admission process for the Medicine Programme
