Federica Sandy Curcio is a PhD candidate in Public Policies of Cohesion and Convergence at the Department of Political Sciences, University of Naples Federico II, where she is affiliated with the LUPT research centre and the TE|DI Observatory (Territori Digitali). Her research focuses on mine-to-port logistics chains and the vulnerability of transport infrastructures in EU–Africa supply chains for critical raw materials.

She holds a Master's degree in International Relations and Scenario Analysis (110/110 cum laude, 2023) from Federico II, with a thesis on the geopolitics of the energy transition and critical raw material dependencies, supervised by Professor Daniela La Foresta.

Her research experience includes a position as assistant on the Horizon Europe project BIOFAIRNET (2025), focused on bioeconomy and climate vulnerability in European regions, and a policy analysis internship at the Centro Studi Internazionali (CESI) in Rome, where she contributed to analytical work on the MENA region and the broader Mediterranean. She is an active member of several learned societies, including A.GE.I. (Working Group on Logistics and Transport), SSG, and AIIG Campania, and serves as Vice President of the Osservatorio N.A.M.A.
