He holds a Master's degree in Psychology from the Jagiellonian University in Kraków. He completed postgraduate studies in 'Contemporary Migration' at the Centre for Migration Research at the University of Warsaw and at the School of Human Rights run by the Helsinki Foundation for Human Rights. Since 2015, he has been involved with the Podkarpackie Association for Active Families (PSAR), a non-governmental organisation working in the fields of education and culture, human rights (particularly the rights of children and migrants) and humanitarian aid. He was one of the founders of PSAR and currently serves as the director of programme development. He has co-created and implemented projects, including psychosocial support for refugees and their families, the integration of Polish and Ukrainian pupils in schools, peer support projects for young people, and substance abuse prevention. He has been involved in, amongst others, the TUTU Family Centre, the international youth club Space4Youth, and the "School that Connects" project for Polish and Ukrainian students. He represents the organisation in relations with external partners, including UN agencies and international NGOs.
