Kamila Schöll-Mazurek, Ph.D., is a political scientist and migration expert specializing in democratic participation, EU citizenship, and anti-migrant mobilization in Europe. She is the Federal Executive Director of the Polish Social Council (Polnischer Sozialrat) in Berlin — one of the largest Polish migrant self-organizations in Germany and a recognized advocate for the rights and political participation of EU citizens.

Her work focuses on democratic resilience, labor migration, social inequality, multilingualism, and the institutional inclusion of mobile European populations. She has led and contributed to numerous international projects on migration governance, civic engagement, discrimination, and social cohesion, particularly in the context of Central and Eastern Europe.

Dr. Schöll-Mazurek combines academic research with policy and civil society practice. She regularly cooperates with public institutions, universities, and transnational networks on issues related to migration, democracy, and human rights. Her current work explores how democratic institutions respond to political polarization, anti-migrant narratives, and the exclusion of migrant communities from democratic participation.

At the 6th International Congress of Human Rights at the University of Rzeszów, she will speak on democratic resilience, anti-migrant sentiment, and the role of civic participation and local institutions in protecting human rights and strengthening inclusive democracy in Europe.
