



## Klaus Larres

Prof. Klaus Larres, Ph.D., is the *Richard M. Krasno Distinguished Professor of History and International Affairs* at the University of North Carolina (UNC) in Chapel Hill, NC. At UNC he is also the Director of the *Krasno Global Affairs and Business Council* and the *Krasno Global Events Series*. He is also a Global Fellow at the Wahba Initiative for Strategic Competition at New York University.

Previously Klaus Larres served as *Counselor & Senior Policy Adviser* at the German Embassy in Beijing, China, held the *Henry Kissinger Chair in International Relations* at the Library of Congress in Washington, DC, was selected as a Member of the *Institute for Advanced Study (IAS)* in Princeton, NJ, and was a Visiting Fellow at Germany's leading think tank, the German Institute for International and Security Affairs (SWP) in Berlin.

Recently he was a Visiting Scholar at the Center for European Studies of Harvard University and a Global Fellow at the Woodrow Wilson Center in Washington, DC.

Larres has published widely - both books and scholarly articles. He also is a regular columnist on contemporary politics for a large German daily newspaper and is often interviewed by the international media.

In his research and writing Larres focuses on the political, economic and security relations between the US-China-EU. At present he is working on a book provisionally entitled "China as a Cause of Transatlantic Tension from the 1990s to the Present."
