Associate Professor Krzysztof Żarna, University of Rzeszów.

He graduated in History from the Pedagogical University in Rzeszów (1999), obtained a PhD in Humanities in the field of History from the University of Rzeszów (2005), and received a habilitation in Social Sciences in the discipline of Political Science, with a specialisation in International Relations, from the Jagiellonian University in Kraków (2016). He is also a graduate of the School of Human Rights at the Helsinki Foundation for Human Rights in Warsaw (2002) and completed postgraduate studies in Educational Management at the University of Information Technology and Management in Rzeszów (2006). He currently holds the position of Dean of the Faculty of Social Sciences. His research interests include international relations, internal security, national and ethnic minorities, and human rights, with particular emphasis on the Slovak Republic, war crimes, and genocide in the territory of the former Yugoslavia. He is the author of 150 publications and has delivered approximately one hundred papers at national and international academic conferences. He has initiated and organised six editions of international human rights congresses. He is a member of Associazione Territori Digitali (Te|Di), the European International Studies Association, the Polish Association for European Studies, the Polish Political Science Association, the Polish Society for Security Studies, and the Polish Association of International Relations. He collaborates with numerous foreign academic institutions, including the University of Leipzig, the University of Naples Federico II, the University of Prešov, Matej Bel University in Banská Bystrica, the Pan-European University in Bratislava, the Slovak Academy of Sciences, the Institute for Public Affairs in Bratislava, the Ukrainian Catholic University in Lviv, Ivan Franko National University of Lviv, Vasyl Stefanyk Precarpathian National University in Ivano-Frankivsk, the Hetman Petro Sahaidachnyi National Army Academy in Lviv, Kyiv National University of Trade and Economics, the University of Belgrade, the University of Pécs, and the Association for International Affairs in Prague. He is the principal investigator of the research project “Migrants from Ukraine in the Podkarpackie Voivodeship: Socio-economic implications” (2024–2027) funded under the programme Regional Excellence Initiative, and coordinates the international research network “The phenomenon of populism in Europe.”
