Dr Marcin Jastrzębski is a lecturer at the Faculty of Political Science and Administration at Kazimierz Wielki University in Bydgoszcz (UKW), where he works in the Department of Political Systems and the Digital State.

His broad research interests combine law with political science, focusing on international law, international and Polish systems of human rights protection, and political freedoms — in particular the right to free elections. Their most recent work analyses the intersections of cyberspace and artificial intelligence (AI), the crisis of democracy, and the evolution of contemporary party systems, with a particular focus on how electoral mechanisms shape political landscapes.

As an active member of the academic community, he has undertaken numerous international research placements under the Erasmus+ programme, including residencies at universities in Muğla (Turkey), Tenerife and Granada (Spain). In addition to his academic work, he has significant practical experience as a member and representative of UKW on the Council for Human Rights and Equal Treatment in Bydgoszcz, reporting to the Mayor of Bydgoszcz, working on translating human rights theory into local administrative practice.
