



Marek Skulimowski

An accomplished former Polish diplomat, businessman, and philanthropist, Marek Skulimowski is committed to advancing the Foundation's vision of promoting education and Polish culture. Under his leadership, the Foundation is entering its centennial and setting new standards in cultural diplomacy and outreach.

Skulimowski has tracked down artwork stolen by the Nazis and negotiated the return of these masterpieces to Poland. As a board member of the Polish National Library, he works to preserve Poland's antique books and historical records for future generations.

When Russia started bombing Ukraine, he went to the border with food and medicine to help women and children escape the war. He offered his home to refugees and started a campaign that raised nearly \$2 million to help Ukrainians fleeing to Poland.

Before leading the Kosciuszko Foundation, Skulimowski served as Deputy Consul General of the Republic of Poland in New York and as Political Counselor at the Embassy of Poland in Tel Aviv. He also directed U.S. Operations for INGLOT Cosmetics, expanding its presence across more than 40 locations and 100 distribution outlets nationwide.

He has an extensive business and management background as well as deep knowledge of Poland, its culture, and its people. Born in Lubaczów, Poland, and a graduate of the University of Warsaw's American Studies Center, Skulimowski is highly regarded for his commitment to promoting Polish-Jewish understanding and respect.
