Dr. Mirosław Natanek. Historian (Jagiellonian University) and Europeanist (studied at Université Paul Valéry Montpellier III). Assistant Professor at the Institute of European Studies, Jagiellonian University. His research interests focus primarily on the history of European integration and its local government dimension, as well as international cooperation among European local governments. He also has a special interest in the activities of the Council of Europe, where he has completed two research fellowships, and in the European aspirations of the Balkan states. In these areas, he has authored over a dozen chapters in collective works and scholarly articles (also in foreign languages). As a collaborator with the Istituto di Sociologia Internazionale di Gorizia (ISIG), he has also co-authored expert reports for the Council of Europe. He has received multiple Erasmus and CEEPUS scholarships and a scholarship from The Ryoichi Sasakawa Foundation. He has lectured and been a visiting professor at, among others, at the Université catholique de Louvain (Belgium), Univerzita Mateja Bela, Banská Bystrica and the University of Presov (Slovakia), Pázmány Péter Katolikus Egyetem, Budapest and the University of Pécs (Hungary), Univerzita Palackého, Olomouc (Czech Republic) and Technische Univeristät Chemnitz and the University of Leipzig (Germany). Member of the Polish Society for European Studies and president of its Krakow branch.
