



## Monika Trojanowska-Strzęboszewska

She is the Head of the European Studies Unit. She is a member of the Polish European Science Association and the Polish European Community Studies Association. She has been a member of the Council for Refugees and Migrants of the Polish Bishops' Conference of the Catholic Church since 2025.

Her research interests include immigration and asylum policies in the EU, the functioning of the Schengen Area, and various aspects of internal security and human rights in Europe. She also focuses her research on the civic and political integration of immigrants in European host countries. She was the head of the research project, funded by NCN, titled 'Participation in the public and political spheres of immigrants from Ukraine living in Poland - a preliminary study' (2023-2025). In October 2024, she was at a study visit in Brussels (EC, EP, Permanent Representation of Poland to the EU), organised in the frame of the project titled 'Three Seas Initiative Research Centre' affiliated with the Institute of Political Studies of the Polish Academy of Sciences. In recent years, she has given lectures at the following universities in Europe: the Universidade Nova de Lisboa, the University of Naples Federico II, Charles University in Prague, the University of Vienna, and the Pan-European University in Bratislava.
