



## Parvin Ahanchi

Dr. Parvin Ahanchi is Associate Professor of History at Garabagh University. She previously served as a leading researcher at the A.A. Bakikhanov Institute of History and Ethnology and the Institute of Archaeology and Anthropology of the Azerbaijan National Academy of Sciences.

She received her Ph.D. in History from Lomonosov Moscow State University and held fellowships and visiting appointments at the Max Planck Institute of History, Goettingen the University of Wisconsin-Madison and the University of California, Davis (Fulbright Program), San José State University, the International Institute of Social History in Amsterdam, and Leibniz University Hannover.

She holds the “Emanuel Nobel Memorial Medal” for contributions to digital archival initiatives. Her interdisciplinary research focuses on collective memory, forced displacement, missing persons, oral history, and the human consequences of armed conflicts in the South Caucasus, particularly the Karabakh conflict, and contributes to field-based studies on post-conflict reconstruction, civilian separation, and war-related memory practices. She has presented internationally across Europe, North America, and Eurasia.
